LANG 1130 Cantonese for Non-Chinese Language Background Students I

1. Course Information: LANG 1130 is a credit-bearing Cantonese elective course for UST undergraduates of non-Chinese speaking background. It will equip students with the Cantonese proficiency and communication competence necessary for living and networking in Hong Kong, thus facilitating their smooth integration into the local community. The learning activities involve developing students' listening and speaking skills in an attempt to build learners' confidence and fluency in using Cantonese for daily communication. Students attend three hours of class and complete up to six hours of out-of-class work, per week. The course is offered in Fall and Spring semesters.

2. Pre-requisites: LANG 1130 is open to UST undergraduates of non-Chinese speaking background (including exchange students) and for complete beginners only. No pre-requisites and co-requisites are required.
